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


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PCF strucuture

1 transversal component

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


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PCF implementation modalities



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PCF Co-ordination

- Coordination with the EU and the EUDs aims to ensure synergy and complementarity with existing and planned, country-specific and regional actions in the EaP countries;
- Inclusive co-ordination with the national stakeholders mechanism of PCF national co-ordinators;
- Comprehensive co-ordination with the EU and other international partners and donors in the field -regular meetings with EUD and donors;
- Interactions between the CoE Field Offices, EUDs and the national coordinators/stakeholders- PCF Annual Coordination Platform.

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Role of PCF National Co-ordinators

National co-ordinators are **a "National focal point"** for PCF coordination, implementation, assessment and:

Assist in the implementation of country-specific and regional projects, and in sustaining their impact at country and regional level;

Assess developments, provide feedback, advice and guidance, contribute to create synergies with other projects;

Facilitate interactions with national stakeholders;

Support PCF visibility and communication activities.

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PCF Steering Committee Meetings

 PCF implementation is monitored by a Steering Committee co-chaired by the European Commission and the Council of Europe.

 The Steering Committee is responsible for the implementation of the PCF, approves the Annual Plan of Action and Annual Progress Report.
